To establish an objective measure of an individual's knowledge and competence in the field of management accounting; and 4. To encourage continued professional development by management accountants. <p>The CMA (Certified Management Accountant) is the advanced professional certification specifically designed to measure the accounting and financial management skills that drive business performance. Achieving the CMA credential demonstrates your mastery of financial planning, analysis, control, and decision support, as well as professional ethics.</p>

If you are not already a member, Join IMA now. • Bachelor’s degree from an accredited college or university or an equivalent degree as determined by an independent evaluation agency. Please reference the Education Qualification Section of the CMA Handbook. • Two continuous years of professional experience in management accounting or financial management. Please reference the Experience Qualification section of the CMA Handbook. • Entrance into the CMA program. • Completion of Part 1 and Part 2 of the CMA exam.
